Ignasi Labastida (Universitat de Barcelona) - moderator

Ignasi Labastida is the Head of the Office for Knowledge Dissemination (www.ub.edu/odc) at the Universitat de Barcelona where he is also leading the Research Unit at the CRAI (Learning and Research Resource Center). From this Office he is leading different projects towards openness related with open educational resources, open access and open data within his own institution and partnering with external institutions. The Universitat de Barcelona is the affiliate institution of Creative Commons in Spain since its beginning in 2003, and Ignasi has been the public leader during all those years. He has been a member of the OCW Consortium (www.ocwconsortium.org/) Board of Directors on behalf of Creative Commons and a member of the Administrative Council of Communia (www.communia-association.org/), an International Association on the Public Domain built on the eponymous Thematic Network, funded by the European Commission from 2007 to 2011. Currently, he is engaged in the LEARN project (http://learn-rdm.eu/) funded by the European Commission aimed at the implementation of the LERU Roadmap for Research Data. He is also member of the Steering Committee of the CIO Community of the LERU.

Enzo Valente (GARR e Italian National Delegate in the E-Infrastructure Reflection Group)

Enzo Valente: Physicist (High Energy Physics) with 450+ publications on international journals; co-founder and first director of the Italian National Research and Education Network GARR since 2003 (www.garr.it); Lecturer of Instrumental Methods for Subnuclear Physics at Physics Department of University of Rome "Sapienza"; Italian representative in various international bodies, like the European Research and Education Network Policy Committee, GÉANT Association, e-Infrastructure Reflection Group and others.

Wouter Haak (Elsevier)

Wouter Haak is responsible for research data management at Elsevier. Prior to this, he was responsible for Elsevier's product strategy for Scopus, ScienceDirect and Mendeley. Both roles share the core focus on delivering tools that improve research outcomes. In the area of data, use and re-use is increasingly important. This goes beyond the availability of data – it is about data normalization, discoverability, trust, credit, and overall integration. Therefore the future of research is about the ability to better share data where all stakeholders benefit. Prior to Elsevier, Wouter has a background in online product and strategy roles. He worked for more than 5 years at eBay Classifieds, e.g. Marktplaats.nl, Kijiji.it – in roles varying from business development to overall responsibility for the classifieds businesses in Italy, France, Belgium and Turkey. Strategy experience comes from having worked with the Boston Consulting Group for 7 years. Finally, Wouter has also worked for two start-up/early stage tech companies. His role has always been to bridge the understanding between the customer, end-user and technical opportunities.

Gerhard Budin (Centre for Translation Studies, Universität Wien)

Gerhard Budin is full professor for terminology studies and translation technologies at the Centre for Translation Studies of the University of Vienna. His research interests focus on corpus linguistics, language technologies, terminology and communication studies, digital humanities, carrying out many EU-funded or national research projects. He is a member of the Austrian Academy of Sciences where he founded the Insitute for Corpus Linguistics and Text Technologies in 2010.

Donatella Castelli (CNR-Isti, OpenAIRE)

Donatella Castelli is a Senior Researcher working at the National Research Council of Italy (CNR). She has been the principal investigator of several European and International funded projects on digital libraries and data e-Infrastructures. She is currently the technical director of OpenAIRE, the Open Access infrastructure for Research in Europe, and coordinator of the EU BlueBRIDGE project that is operating a data infrastructure to support scientific activities for policy and social advice in the marine and aquaculture sectors. She is a member of Research Data Alliance Europe project promoting research and cross-infrastructure coordination at global level.

Paola Galimberti (Università degli Studi di Milano, AISA)

Paola Galimberti is responsible for the Institutional repository of the University of Milan, for the ojs e-publishing platform and she supports of the internal and external assessment exercises (at individual and departmental level).
