Sphaeriacei Britannici Cent I
are all gone long ago.
and I do not think I
have more Cent II than
are subscribed for. I think
I sent Herr Johannes Kunze
the last.

I do not wish to trouble
you with a large number
of exchange specimens
because if you send a
great number you are
sure to send very common
species which everybody
knows.

I will in the course of
a few days send you by
post a packet of
50 *sphaeria* not the very
commonest kinds (unless
indeed you particularly wish
them).

In return I should be

glad to receive a similar
number. of fungi of all
kinds especially such
such as you have in Italy
and we do not get here.

For instance Favolus Europaeus.

Clathrus cancellatus. &c

Polyporus tubaster &c &c &c.

all ascomycetes will be
very acceptable to me.

Is there any particular species
~~genus~~ or class you wish
to see that I could procure
for you?
