Sir

Mr Tommasini having communicated to me your wish to have a catalogue of the plants that I found this year in Dalmatia, I have written out a list of such as appeared to me most worthy of notice. As a foreigner, only acquainted with the Flora of the north of Europe, I have probably passed over many as common and uninteresting which in a Southern country are considered scarce. The following may possibly be new to the Dalmatian - *Pippule napsaliensis*, *Cirsium bellianus*, *Coronilla juncea*, *Papaver Lybidum*, *Cistaceae pycnantha*, *Arenaria Halleri* Hb. (found by Prof. Poter & sent to Gratz) *Schapis incana*, an *Scotis* var. *Crucifera* not described in DC. *Podium* - resembling *tinctoria* but with white fruit, *Sisymbrium irio* L. *Helleborus viridis* M. B. *Stachys cretica*, *Lotus gracilis*, *Penstemon compressus*, *Vicia Broteriana*, (perhaps the same as *Waste* Vir) *Adiantum Hallianum*, *Cucullaria leptophylla*, *Chenopodium podocarpum*, *Verbascum floccosum* W. & A. *Plantago integralis*, *Thymus creticus*. Had I had the honour of seeing you on your journey through Gratz, I should have been delighted to have shown you the collection, and communicated by duplicates to you. I am on the point of starting for my return to England. My best respects and kind regards to Professor Tommasini.
