My dear Sir,
While at Harvard University
last year, I was interested in
certain fungi that were found
on potato tubers. Three of
the more important forms I
could not determine. I grew
them in pure cultures on agar
& from these I made transfers to
sterilized potato, the surface of
which I send you. I have the
fungi in sealed agar tubes now
in case the specimens do not
prove good. As I expect to publish
a paper soon, you will confer a
very great favor if you will tell
me the names of the 3 fungi in
question. One has the habit of
Isaria, the other two are Mucedineae.
