NB. There is a curious  
mucedine in white tufts  
on Oak leaf. (inferior)  
which appears to be new  
Ravenel n.º 1928.

I send you these, as  
I have upwards of 100.  
specimens just received  
for determination, and  
shall have occupation  
for some time to come.

to be with me for a week  
making mycological  
excursions in this  
country.
