

*Marasmius juglandis* B & C

Pileus flatly expanded, irregular pale sooty umber, smooth, thin flaccid (2 cm broad) Stem angular, hollow, compressed above, darker below, pruinose, colour of the pileus 2-3 cm long 2-3 mm thick. Gills unequal, adnate watery white, thin, flaccid, spores subglobose  $4 \times 3 \mu$

on Anchovy log, amongst moss  
Alabama

*Marasmius chrysospermus* Trog  
in Herb Berke

Pileus soon expanded, plano-convex, faintly radiato-sulcate when dry, pale umber, smooth (2-4 c.m diam) flesh thin. Stem cylindrical, equal, whitish, (3-5 cm long 5 mm thick) base strigose. Gills adnate, rather broad and distant (dark when dry) spores  $10 \times 7 \mu$  with a yellowish tinge

on rotting straw Dingalu (Helvetia?)
