assigned it to your Botrytis tenella, only the
branchlets end in a knob & not acutely.
thus  Would you kindly inform me if
this also occurs in your species or does it
belong to the Polyactis subdivision &
probably new.

fungi of Australia & trust you receive
occasional papers sent. Can you give me an
idea of a few of the most generally useful &
not too expensive illustrated works on fungi
