Dear Doctor Saccardo:

Since this war has disturbed communication I have missed your valued help in determining our fungi. When the United States entered the war I volunteered as Medical officer and served from Aug. 1917 to Dec. 1918. in various parts of the U.S.A. I collected fungi whenever I had time and I am sending you some of the material for determination.

On April 18. 1917 I sent you my last packet of N.Dak. Fungi containing about 27 species. As no answer has been received concerning this lot I presume they were lost. May I ask if you received them? There were some new things in it of which I have very little material left. I enclose a list of the numbers this packet contained.

In the packet of specimens I am sending you today I am including specimens from Utah, Arkansas, Kansas and N. Dak.
