Museum) purchased the first set, and
wishes me to say to any others that he
is greatly pleased with them.

More than half the species are not
in Herpel's collection from the Black
Forest, and mine are much finer.

My collection is from the South of
England, and would make a good
addition to any Continental collection.

I have also sold sets of 70 species
to the Universities of Oxford, Glasgow,
and Manchester — £2000 each set.

And I have sold sets to the Berlin
Botanical Museum, to Munich, and
to Hamburg.
