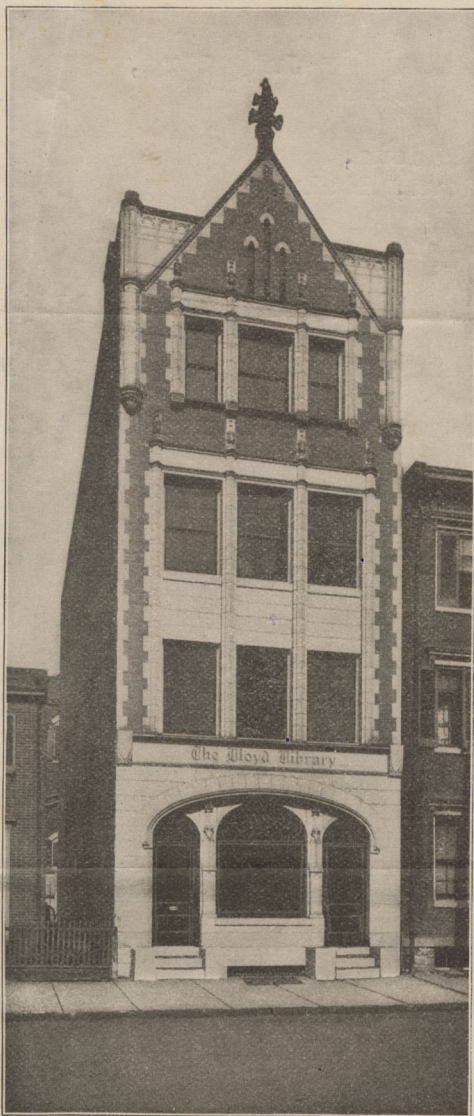

## The Lloyd Library

This Library is devoted to botany, pharmacy, chemistry, and allied sciences. The building contains between fifteen and twenty thousand volumes and pamphlets on the aforementioned subjects. The herbarium of pressed plants is extensive, and the mycological department contains four or five thousand specimens, the fleshy fungi being preserved in alcohol in jars. This library is incorporated, is free to the public, and is pledged to be donated intact to science. The final resting place has not been decided upon, but the library will be placed in the University best calculated to serve science.
