I understand that Dr. Rehm died sometime ago. Do you know what has become of his collection; also could you provide me with a copy of his photograph, or advise me where I could write to get one?

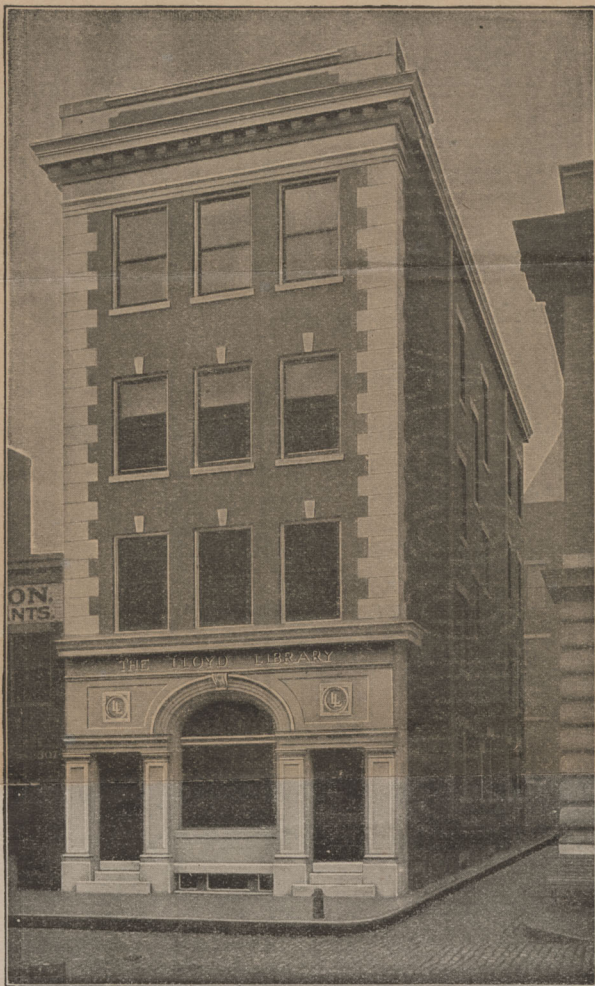
