as can be spared - so that I can use it in my
various experiments. If you could collect specimens

to dry naturally) in the autumn, I should be very
grateful. I shall send you a reprint in a few
weeks which will explain my need of material
from different localities. I am hard on at work
on 'biologic forms.'
