My dear Sir, I am very much obliged to you for your kindness in sending me these Oidia. I now return them; I have made drawings of them, and shall give the determinations in my Revision when published. I thank you also for the copy of Prof. Cocconi's paper, ~~and~~ and Dr. Scalia's specimens, &c. — all of which I will return shortly. Oidiopsis is not the conidial stage of Phyllactinia certainly; but, probably, the conidial stage of Erysiphe taurica, as I have seen examples of undoubted E. taurica with ^(continued) endophytic mycelium, producing conidiophores, which are usually branched, and which emerge through the stomata!

Thank you for the O. on Euonymus japonicus (Should not the name be Oidium euonymi-japonici). I have frequently observed the occurrence of Cladosporium on old Oidium-patches, but have no evidence of any parasitism of the Cladosporium. — I send a specimen of Irish S. mors-suae for your acceptance.
