Could you perhaps tell me the name of the enclosed Stemphylium which I find occasionally in laboratory cultures? It appears to be very near S.botryosum as far as the size and form of its spores are concerned, yet differs in that the latter are quite smooth and in its habitat (fimicolous).

Having been quite overwhelmed with Laboulbeniae it is a long time since I have written to you but I shall always remember with the greatest pleasure the glimpse I had of you when Mrs. Thaxter and I were at Padua.
