I have been working over your species of Penicillium. I find that P.olivaceum of Wehmer is the same as P.digitatum .IN citing the literature of this species you go back to Micheli-plate 91 fig. 3, citing your use of digitatum from Fries, who cites it from Persoon, and it is also cited from Bulliard and the same authors note also that Linnaeus in 1753 used the same plate in Mighids Micheli's Genera Plantarum as the basis of Mucor caespitosus. I have found your material in Mycotheca italica no.986 in the Herb.of the U.S.Dept.Agr.I am satisfied that I know therefore what you mean by this species by but in using the name I am unable to find out whether you based such use upon definite certainty that this was Monilia digitata according to Fries and Persoon or not? Was this included in the Herbarium of Micheli ?In other words, do we know what Micheli's plate 91 fig. 3 really was? If we do, x rules of namenclature would make this P.caespitosum(L) ? If we do not know what Micheli and Persoon worked with, do we not come down to your material 1881 as referred to in Fungi italici as the first full description with material known? I would be very muchobliged to you if you would write me your opinion as to the proper use of this name. In a paper I am just sending in I am letting it stand as P. digitatum Sacc.non Fries What do you think? Very truly yours,
