Dear Prof. Trotter:-

I was very much grieved to learn of Professor Saccardos death and wanted to write you sooner in this regard. The world has lost its foremost mycologist and one of its most enthusiastic scientist. I trust, however, that his work will go right along under your direction.

The corrected manuscript of Prof. Saccardos', which you sent, just arrived. I shall attend to the publication and proof reading of the article and when it is printed, I shall send fifty separates to you. I thank you cordially for making the corrections.

I most certainly prefer to have you work over all my Philippine Fungi that I sent to Professor Saccardo, if you so desire. If, however, you feel that you cannot handle the entire collection, I shall be perfectly willing to have you send a part to Dr. Sydow. Some time ago I wrote Dr. Sydow stating that I had a large number of specimens of fungi in Professor Saccardos hands, and I stated that it might be possible for him to obtain some of the material for identification. I, however, stated that I would write you first in this regard. I shall

leave the disposal of my collections entirely in your hands. If you care to handle all, it is my personal wish that you retain them for determination. If, however, you feel that you cannot handle the entire number you may send some to Dr. Sydow.

If any of Professor Saccardos identifications on my specimens have been published on, I wish you would send me separates of the work. I shall be perfectly willing to publish any completed manuscripts that you may have on Philippine fungi, as I am extremely anxious to obtain the determinations.

I extend to you and your associates my most deeply felt sympathy because of Professor Saccardos death. I trust, however, that the good work will go along and I thank you cordially for your kind consideration, I remain,
